Father: – We the undersigned Chiefs of the
Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte beg to return
you thanks, on behalf of our tribe,
for your circular letter suggesting that
we contribute something towards the
relief of our suffering fellow subjects &
Christian Brethren in Ireland & Scotland.

We feel we have too many poor among
ourselves to give much; but we beg
you will accept the sum of twelve
pounds ten shillings Currency; as a
small proof of our sympathy with them
& we hereby authorize you to apply for t
he same to be paid out of the annuity
accruing to us, from Government for lands
ceded by us to the Crown.

With much respect, we remain
your obedient Servants.
